CHORAL EVENSONG



THE COVENTRY SINGERS, seen in the Calendar, are directed by Mia Hall Savage. The ensemble is open to all youth from 6th grade to seniors in high school. The training received in this lively and energetic group requires no prior experience. They rehearse on Wednesday evenings and join the Trinity Choir the last Sunday of the month, September to May.

THE CHORISTERS are shown below. Directed by Amy Polo, the group is open to all children, 1st through 5th grades. Rehearsing Sunday mornings, September to May, they provide musical leadership for the services in Kempton Hall as they learn introductory part singing and vocal technique.

IN RESIDENCE: Trinity is happy, once again, to host the Pacific Youth Choir, directed by Mia Hall Savage.



THE TRINITY CHOIR, seen above, consists of a large group of auditioned singers from all walks of life—students, home makers, lawyers, teachers, doctors, businessmen and women, public servants, retirees, and musicians, to name a few—all of whom share a fierce dedication to the craft of choral singing in a liturgical context, and to one another. They are ordinary people who make extraordinary music.

THE CATHEDRAL CHAMBER SINGERS is an ensemble of professional vocalists numbering from sixteen to twenty-six singers, depending on the music being sung. The members, some of the finest singers in the Portland area, are drawn from a number of professional, academic and church choirs. In addition to two Choral Evensong services this season, the Chamber Singers will join forces with the Trinity Choir for *Christmas at the Cathedral*.



New for Trinity Cathedral's 2011-12 season, Choral Evensong will expand on the Cathedral Vespers of recent years. The Service of Choral Evensong grew out of the 16th century's extraordinary outpouring of music, literature and drama, adapting the older Rites of Vespers and Compline and creating a link to the very beginnings of Christian liturgy. Help us celebrate this rich choral repertory and deeply affecting service—a treasure of the English-speaking world and our touchstone to the divine on the eve of the work week.
