DEAR FRIENDS,



Like many of you, I spent some time around the new year reflecting on 2023 and everything it meant in my life – the changes, challenges, and joys I experienced over the past twelve months. This Annual Report, along with our yearly Annual Meeting, allows the Trinity community the opportunity to do the same: to reflect on our highs and our lows and, perhaps, to set some intentions for the year ahead.

2023 began as a challenging year for Trinity. We experienced the last of five significant staff retirements, experimented with being “down a priest,” and expanded the role of lay canons to include preaching, pastoral care, sacramental leadership, and strategic direction.

Canon Shana McCauley is transitioning into a new role as Canon Vicar, overseeing the day-to-day management of Trinity’s ministry programs and administration. Canon Charissa Simmons, one of our longest-tenured staff members, has stepped into new leadership and new responsibilities as Canon for Spiritual Formation.

Canon Katie Webb, in her second year leading Trinity’s renowned music program, has established her voice and has gained the trust of her musicians – Katie’s vision for music is once again putting Trinity on the national radar screen. And we’ve added Canon Liz Harlan-Ferlo, one of the finest teachers I know, as Canon for Education and the Arts.

This team of four incredible women shares in the day-to-day as well as the long-term vision for Trinity, and I am over the moon to be working with one of the finest leadership teams I’ve experienced in my fifteen years at the Cathedral.

The staff and the ministries are strong – and, as you’ll read in Senior Warden Greg Harris’ report, Trinity’s vestry continues their focus on our long-term vision even as we manage the day-to-day anxiety of serving a downtown population where drug use and mental health issues are increasing.


Trinity has long held a commitment to our neighborhood, throwing open our gates each day to hundreds of hungry people. This commitment to outreach and social justice has never put more stress on our building and our sexton staff, who are daily called upon to act as security guards, social workers, biohazard experts and property managers – often within a fifteen-minute window. The daily stress that this situation puts on our staff and volunteers is growing, and I invite your prayers and your support as Trinity works with state and local leaders to find better responses to the humanitarian crisis unfolding on the streets of Portland.

Through all of this, Kempton Hall has emerged as the locus for so much of our community's work. Approaching its hundredth birthday, the beauty of our parish hall has become a focal point for music events, lectures and receptions, diocesan events, and our weekly Wednesday Lunch. Kempton is now serving as Trinity's food pantry, houses our organ scholar, and provides the kitchen support for feeding hundreds of hungry people every week.

Understandably, Kempton is in need of significant improvements (one bad windstorm and we could be faced with a real crisis). So Trinity's vestry has been working on the preliminary stages of a capital campaign, focused on improvements to the Kempton Hall roof and kitchen. We hope to launch this campaign early in 2024. Stay tuned!

Through it all, friends, your support and generosity are what make this community unique among Episcopal churches. Every so often, I have the opportunity to travel and visit churches like Trinity across the nation – and I don't know of another church where there is the same level of mature leadership, generous resource, creative thinking, and openness to change. This community is truly setting the national benchmark for what it means to be radically hospitable in a rapidly-changing world.

Let's keep our eye on the ball – and let's keep doing it!

UNCOMMON WARMTH *Community Life & Fellowship*

It has been truly gratifying to witness Trinity's evolution as we distance ourselves from the pandemic! Priorities have shifted, realigning Trinity's Uncommon Warmth to a new chapter of work, play, prayer, wonder, and worship.

In 2023, Trinity embraced three new initiatives:

- **LGBTQIA Friends** met monthly for meals and coffee and led the way at the Portland Pride Parade – leading not only Trinity's contingent, but the Episcopal Church in Western Oregon and the Oregon Synod of the ELCA as well!
- We built community by collaborating with twelve Portland-area Episcopal Churches to establish "Good Grief" – a twice-monthly in-person and online grief support group.
- After a covid hiatus, the **Eucharistic Visiting ministry** resumed in April.

2023 was also marked by moments of joy! Elise Sandusky led a **Fascinator Workshop** just in time for Easter, Palm Sunday featured **two delightful alpacas**, a **bounce house** helped us spring into summer on Trinity Sunday, and we celebrated the holiday season with a delicious **Christmas Cookie Potluck**.



By the numbers...

- **231 handwritten notes** were sent by Trinity's Pastoral Care team as it continued its work of prayer, knitting, crocheting, and reaching out to Trinitarians in times of need and celebration.
- **24 people** who couldn't get to church received visits from our dedicated Eucharistic visitors.
- **62 new & inquiring Trinitarians** were welcomed at periodic Newcomer Lunches, which offered a space for building community and asking questions.
- **35 people** embarked on the five-month journey of Catechesis, our yearly exploration of the Episcopal church, with **15 participants** choosing to be baptized, confirmed, received, or renewed in the spring.
- **40 hosts** and **18 Welcome Center volunteers** extended hospitality to visitors and newcomers.

HOLY COMPASSION *Trinity Outreach*

Our thanks to all our faithful supporters who have contributed in so many ways to our important ministries, becoming God's hands and feet in the Portland area. Here are some of the things you supported in the past year:

Highlights:

- We have partnered with Family Promise to support short-term emergency shelter for **houseless families** in the Portland area.
- We have started a collaboration with WeShine to construct and manage a **tiny home village** on the property of St. Andrew Episcopal Church in North Portland.
- We formed a partnership with Interfaith Alliance on Poverty, focused on **education and advocacy**.
- We held two successful drives for household items to support **area refugees**, in conjunction with SOAR (a program of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon) and the Refugee Care Collective.
- Our volunteers took part in two **trainings in de-escalation** of disruptive and threatening behaviors.
- **Jerry Petty** joined the Outreach team as kitchen manager and coordinator of Food Ministries.

By the numbers...

- **160 guests** each week attend our Wednesday Community Meal – a significant increase from 2022.
- **300 traditional holiday meals** were served to our neighbors at Trinity the day before Thanksgiving. Additional meals were provided for New Avenues for Youth and three Transition Projects centers.
- The **101 residents** of Williams Plaza, our neighbor on Everett Street, joined us for a Halloween pizza party and received Christmas greetings and \$25 gift cards.
- **6 days per week**, the Trinity Food Pantry provides nonperishable and ready-to-eat food items to hungry neighbors. The pantry has seen steep increases in the number of guests who line up every day.

ADULT SPIRITUAL FORMATION

Adult Spiritual Formation at Trinity embraces multiple learning styles and a wide variety of formats—from expert presentations to reader-led book groups; from labyrinth walks to contemplative prayer circles.

Highlights:

- New positions were taken by **Charissa Simmons** as Canon for Spiritual Formation, and **Liz Harlan-Ferlo** as Canon for Education and the Arts.
- Weekly **Wednesday Formation Classes** explored a variety of topics, ranging from Trinity history to Process Theology.
- Monthly **Contemplative Mini-Retreats** drew an average of 30 attendees, and contemplative practice expanded to include **Fourth Saturday Meditation**.
- Weekly **Sunday morning Forums** provided responsive, intellectual support for spiritual questions, notably our series on the war in Israel and Gaza.
- The **Labyrinth Guild** hosted monthly in-person and virtual walks, as well as several seasonally themed walks throughout the year. The Good Friday and Advent Labyrinth Walks each attracted **50-60 walkers** from across Portland.
- Lisa Herlinger of Mudita Catering ably took on the task of **Wednesday evening dinners**, feeding an average of **30-40 people** every week!

CHILDREN & YOUTH FORMATION

***F**amily Ministries offers both aged-based and multigenerational experiences in Deep Beauty, Holy Compassion, Intellectual Curiosity, and Uncommon Warmth. We create spaces dedicated to children's and youth formation and connect our young members with the larger community at Trinity and beyond.*



Highlights:

- While the overall population of children at Trinity has decreased over prior years, **the number of children attending regularly increased substantially.**
- Our youth ministry team hosted First Sunday Middle School Hour and Monthly High School Dinner outings.
- Trinity staff and youth participated in overnight diocesan youth events.
- The annual Sauce-On Dinner was back in person after 2 years online!
- Family outreach projects after Church at the Commons benefitted the Trinity Food Pantry, Williams Plaza, the Humane Society, and more.
- Community events like the Advent Fair and Pentecost Party had **high participation** across all age groups!

By the numbers...

- Fall attendance at Godly Play **nearly doubled** over spring attendance!
- **7 adults** served on our Youth Support Team, dedicated to praying for and supporting youth.
- **208 cards** were sent to our youth in 2023!
- **7 youth** completed Youth Confirmation Class and **5 youth** chose to be confirmed.



DEEP BEAUTY *Music, Art & Worship*

TRINITY MUSIC

T*his year, Trinity Music saw a return to pre-pandemic participation in its choral programs and concert series. Faithfully supported by its Music Commission, Trinity's robust and multifaceted choral, instrumental, and concert programming enriches the Cathedral's liturgies, educates our children and youth, and offers top-quality concert performances for our community.*

Highlights:

- We welcomed **Nicholas Stigall** as our new Organ Scholar. His musical gifts, prodigious skills, and humility have already made a huge impact on the Trinity Music community!
- The Trinity Choir School added a third ensemble: the **Low Voice Choir**, a new group for changing or changed lower-voiced singers in middle and high school.
- Trinity Music premiered the new major work ***This Holy Hour*** by Margaret Burk, a new multi-movement suite for choir and harp, at the Christmas Concert, and collaborated with Trinity's Outreach Ministries, Congregation Beth Israel, and Pacific Youth Choirs to present a benefit concert, **The Road Home**, in November.

- **10 recitals** performed on our beautiful Rosales organ
- **17 young singers** in Choristers, Low Voice Choir, and Training Choir
- **50 Trinity Choir members** together spent approximately **6,600 hours** in rehearsals
- **200 organ preludes & postludes** played for Trinity's services

TRINITY ARTS

In 2022-23 the Arts Commission focused on exhibits in the Kempton Gallery as we reaccustomed to in-person fellowship at Trinity and leadership transitions. The commission is beginning work to expand its scope into arts education, installation work, theater, and dance.

Highlights:

- *How Deep is the Water*, a poured-acrylics exhibit by parishioner Allan Oliver. Allan hosted walkthroughs and a demonstration enjoyed by all ages.
- *Thin Places and Dreamscapes*, a mixed media group show by parishioners Linda Barnes, Michael Manwaring, Jonathan Tamez, and Celia Wagner.
- Our annual **Artisan Fair** was ably hosted by Linda Barnes and for three days filled Kempton Hall with local crafters and artists. The Commission donated all Trinity proceeds to the Trinity Outreach.
- Inaugural **Trinity Reading Series** to launch Steve Isaacson's new book of essays, *A Confirmation of Faith*. He will be joined by Liz Harlan-Ferlo, author of *Incarnation, Again*.

Conservate aedificium aridum. At our last annual meeting, we heard the call to keep the building dry, but also in good repair, while paying attention to historical detail, current needs, and planning for the future. This past year has been a year of progress and challenges. Both have been met with a strong effort by the Building & Grounds Committee, our Facilities Managers Elise Sandusky and Jim Hebert, and our crew of Sextons.

Progress is recognizable in the recently renovated Slype bathroom, new carpet in the St. Benedict room, and repairs in Stearns Library. A newly-installed cathedral server, upgrades to the IT system, and enhanced Wi-Fi throughout our buildings provided much-needed technological advances. Installing new hanging microphones in the cathedral nave brought upgraded sound quality to livestreams and recordings.

As is typical for a 117-year-old building, we experienced challenges in the form of minor leaks and water intrusion throughout the year. These were addressed with in-house repairs to the Kempton roof, the bell tower, plumbing and heat pipes, and windows in the Bishop Scott Room. Older toilets were replaced with more efficient ones as we push to be better stewards of our resources and the environment.

Security and safety concerns were met with increased patrols, partnering with the City of Portland's CPTED program (Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design) to aid in campus safety, and two de-escalation trainings organized by the Outreach Commission.

With the continued commitment of our staff, volunteers, and members to keep our campus healthy and our community flourishing, the upcoming year looks promising as we take on new projects and meet the challenges to beautify and renew our Trinity home.

FISCAL YEAR JULY 2022 – JUNE 2023

TTrinity Episcopal Cathedral continues to be financially very healthy, despite the turmoil of Covid recovery, a falling stock market, and rampant inflation – along with a dramatic increase in the community's demand for our services.

Although revenues were almost 6% higher than the prior fiscal year, inflation and increased demand ate up any surpluses. In great part, our overall success comes from the care and attention of every cathedral staff member in their careful control of expenses.

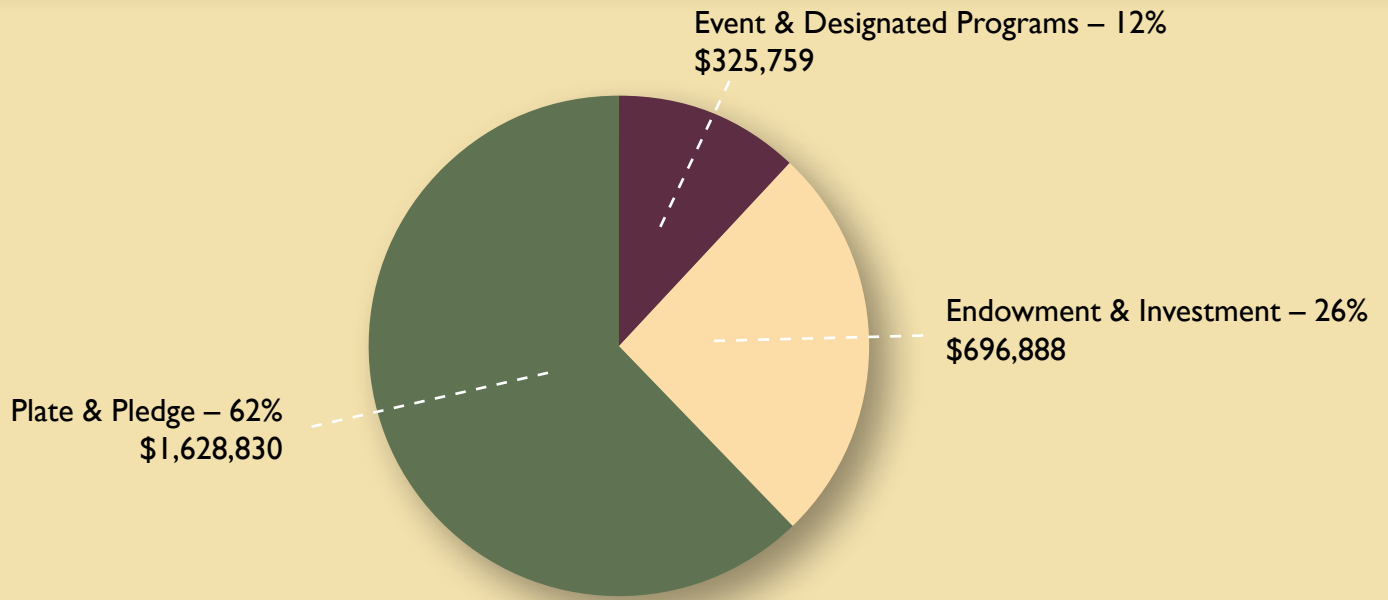
Our annual external audit of 2021-22 went well, and we continue to adjust to ever-changing standards. The audit for 2022-23 is in process. Our new finance manager Paul Flyger has taken full control of all aspects of our complicated finances and is quickly ironing out any wrinkles.

We ended our past fiscal year on budget and have successfully set a new and larger budget for this fiscal year. Our Vestry led a budget forum last May which developed several new ideas and, more importantly, a successful special appeal to boost the annual giving goal to meet the demands of our 2023-2024 budget.

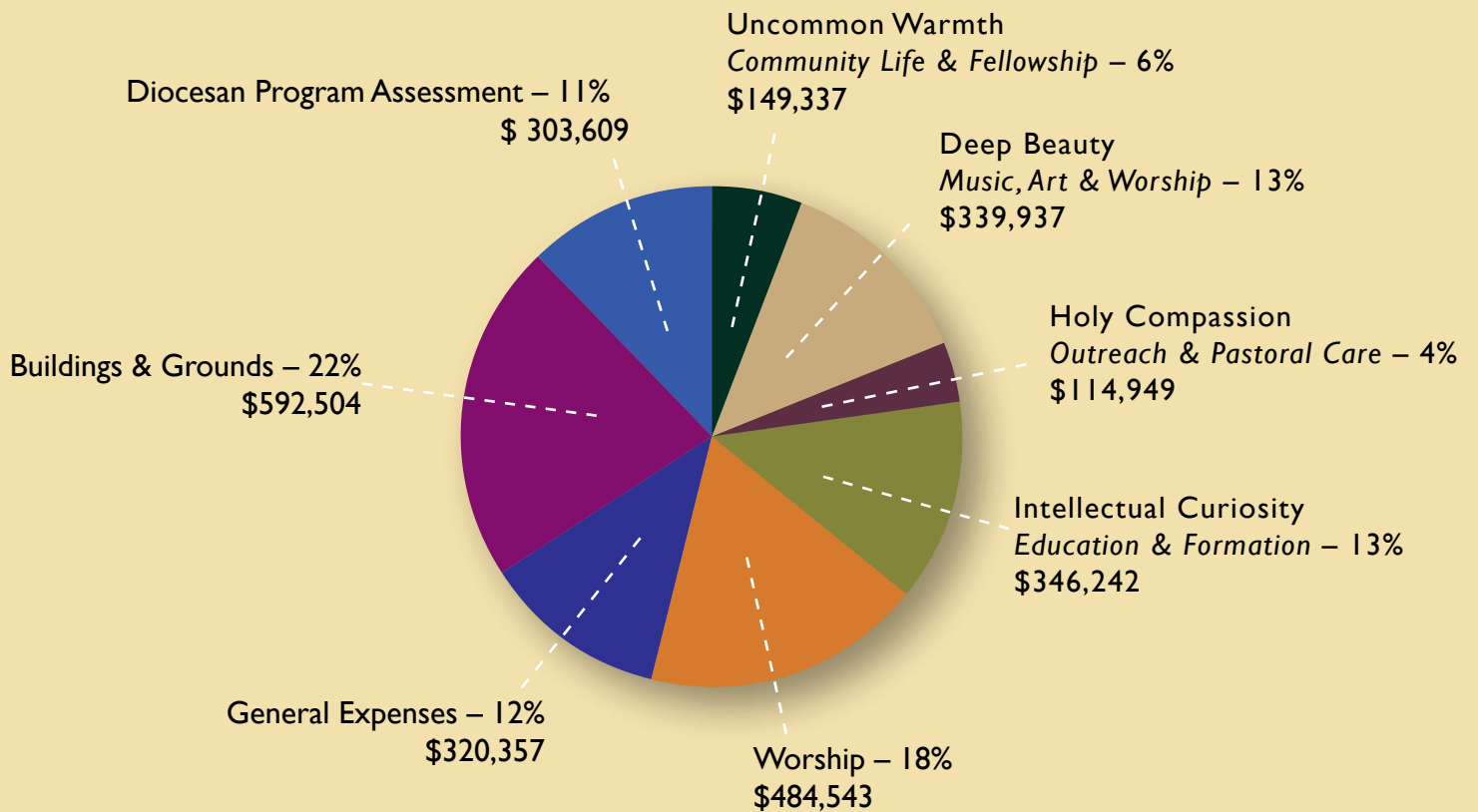
Our funds are being held in short- and long-term investments aiming to optimize return without jeopardizing the principal or our cash flow. Efforts to house these funds in socially responsible products continues.

The finance committee is grateful for the work of the commissions, the budget subcommittee, Paul Flyger, and the Vestry to maintain Trinity's financial viability. Of course, none of this would be possible without the ongoing support of our congregation; thank you all for your generous contributions – and be reassured that your money is being well spent.

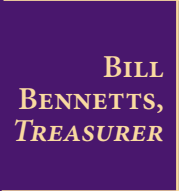

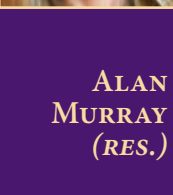

SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

Dear Trinity community,

The 15-member Vestry is responsible for the finances, property, and temporal operations of your cathedral. Beyond the routine functions of administration, this Vestry has been concerned with social justice, safety, and financial stability.

Here is a summary of some of Vestry's 2023 activities and priorities –

Social Justice

Vestry gratefully received 19 recommendations from the Racial Justice Task Force. We delegated some tasks to staff and standing committees while keeping several of the recommendations as Vestry responsibilities, including:

1. Partner with Trinity Outreach to address how to provide more affordable housing
STATUS: Outreach has engaged in community partnerships to support safe, temporary shelter.
2. Develop anti-racist awareness training for parish leaders
STATUS: Vestry members are to complete the Absalom Jones Racial Healing workshop and discuss how to continue the work of strengthening our anti-racist culture.
3. Revise the language of the cathedral governance manual to assure it reflects our open and inclusive values
STATUS: A Vestry task force is reviewing the governance manual to include our social justice priorities.
4. Support socially responsible investment of endowment funds
STATUS: Vestry's Finance Committee added financial support for Craft3 to our investment portfolio. Craft3 is a fund that provides micro-loans to entrepreneurs from traditionally-disenfranchised communities.

This critical work will remain a priority in 2024.

Safety and Security

As an urban parish in a diverse neighborhood, Trinity has firsthand experience with the crisis on Portland's streets. Our challenge is to find a way to hold fast to our value of radical hospitality while preserving the safety and security of our parishioners, guests, and staff.

To that end, Vestry supported additional investment in security services and property safeguards. We also encourage parishioners to take the de-escalation training Trinity offers.

Capital Campaign

This year, Vestry completed initial preparations for a capital fundraising campaign.

As a first step, we hired Community Counseling Service (*CCS Fundraising*), a 75-year-old national consulting firm, who produced a feasibility study which concluded there is support and capacity in the parish.

We envision enhancements to Kempton Hall, and the kitchen will be among our priorities. Parishioners Matt Thompson and Leigh Wilson will lead the campaign.

As I write this, I am filled with appreciation for a particular person who blessed us with her vital presence. Our departed Vestry member Barbara Limandri was an inspiration, and her death in December shocked and dismayed us. Barbara was the moral conscience and working hands of Vestry. She coupled fierce advocacy with a loving spirit, and her passing bows our heads and fills us with energy to continue the work she would have us complete.

In conclusion, we are grateful that you continue to demonstrate commitment and love for our faith community.
