





Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" The Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation." But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, "O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'? 

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke.





Enriching Our Worship, Prayer 2




Officiant






Gluten-free wafers are available; please indicate to the priest if you require this alternative.





MUSIC NOTES

Today's Offertory anthem is a setting of the shape note hymn "Wondrous Love," first printed in 1811. The lyrics for "Wondrous Love" may have been written by Alexander Means, a Methodist pastor from Oxford, Georgia, a few miles from Atlanta. Robert Shaw, who famously directed the Atlanta Master Chorale, and his outstanding creative colleague Alice Parker, collaborated on a host of wonderful arrangements of such melodies, and this lovely setting is one of the highlights of that repertoire. You'll hear the melody in "standard" rhythm and in augmentation - doubling or even quadrupling the note values while other lines weave seamlessly in and around that foundation. We welcome the return of the Choristers at this morning's Eucharist! They offer Robert Powell's round "O praise the Lord, ye children" as today's Communion anthem. Powell (b. 1932) is one of the modern era's most prolific composers of liturgical music; his works are scattered throughout our Hymnal 1982 (including the settings of the Sanctus and Agnus Dei we are using this season!), and his choral anthems are masterworks of both lyricism and contrapuntal economy.
