Enriching Our Worship, Prayer 2




Officiant


Gluten-free wafers are available; please indicate to the priest if you require this alternative.





MUSIC NOTES


Contemporary American composer and performer Caroline Shaw is a musician who, according to her website, "moves among roles, genres, and mediums, trying to imagine a world of sound that has never been heard before but has always existed." I cannot think of a more fitting summary of her work, which is simultaneously familiar and fresh, nostalgic and forward-looking. She has worked with a shocking variety of performers, ranging from Yo-Yo Ma to Kanye West to Renee Fleming, and has composed for a host of symphony orchestras, chamber groups, and professional vocal ensembles. Among her many accolades are the Pulitzer Prize for music, several GRAMMY Awards, and an honorary doctorate from Yale University.

Today's offertory anthem is her imaginative new setting of selected verses from Psalm 84, "and the swallow." This challenging work is in eight parts throughout and features rather beautiful open sonorities, a complex rhythmic profile, and extended techniques for the choir, including some vocal percussion near the work's conclusion. Shaw creates a sound world that beautifully illustrates these familiar verses in a

manner that, somehow, is both austere and deeply emotional.

At Communion, you'll hear the choir sing British composer Sir Edward Elgar's (1857-1934) much-beloved setting of the Eucharistic hymn "Ave Verum Corpus," or "Hail, true body." Elgar's compact, yet rich setting of this ancient text is a long-held favorite of the Anglican choral repertoire and features a soloist in alternation with the full choir.
